1. Weebly – Easy to use, “mostly” free, can add other pages, easy to bump up searchability. Weebly is one of the easiest website builders in the market. They allow you to drag and drop content into a website, so it’s very intuitive to use.



2. Penzu – Personal Journal, can send link to one page at a time to someone, Very private, not searchable. The aim of Penzu is to create an online journal experience that is as similar to writing in a paper-bound journal or diary as possible. While Penzu doesn't offer free-form drawing, it is ideal for writing. And since it is online, there are many benefits to using Penzu rather than paper.



3. Blogger – Blog attached to Google, need a Gmail account, simple format, basically free, can make searchable. Blogger enjoys the fame of being one of the most popular blogging platforms especially for the newbie in the blogging industry. Google has made the site popular because it is free and offers anyone the ability to manage their own blog site without the burden of technicalities in hosting the same.



4. WordPress – Not as intuitive as others, the world’s most widely used Blog, as well as most widely used web page site.

There is a much larger community supporting WordPress, mainly because they have a lot of different designers and programmers that



provide services and build tools (such as plugins) for WordPress users. So finding WordPress experts is relatively easy. The **disadvantage of WordPress is that it is a lot more difficult to use, especially when compared to using Weebly**. On the other side of the coin, **you can do a lot more complex functions with WordPress**, but you will need to either be proficient at using it, or be willing to hire someone to build it for you.
