Some pictures don't belong on Facebook	- You or others consuming drugs or alcohol - Nudity or other inappropriate images
Control who you tag and who tags you	- Tag all friends so they know when a photo has been uploaded of them - Change settings in order to pre-approve all tags of yourself
Don't give out any personal information	- Address - Phone number
Anything you say could get back to the person it was said about	- Family members - Bosses or coworkers
Don't air your dirty laundry	- Bashing your ex for past due child support - Sharing details about a spat with a friend
Consider avoiding features that give away your location, for safety reasons	- Accepting invitations to events - Tagging locations in photos
Customize your security settings	- Only friends can see photos - Limit the access of those you don't know as well
Use your settings to limit the things that prompt Facebook to email you	- Receiving a friend request - Being tagged in a photo
Like organizations or businesses to stay informed about news or discounts	- Special offers - Events near you
Use other social sites to update Facebook as well	- Twitter - Instagram
Chat only when you want to	- Have some friends always see you as offline - Turn off chat to send messages to your inbox
Export your Facebook contacts to other devices	- Smartphone - Home computer
Change settings to control what goes in your news feed	- Games you play - Articles you read
Use Groups to keep in touch with select friends	- Clubs or organizations - Neighborhood associations
